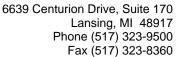

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Independent Auditors' Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting and on Compliance and Other Matters Based on an Audit of Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with Government Auditing Standards

To the Board of Directors of Metro Community Development, Inc. Flint, Michigan

We have audited the financial statements of Metro Community Development, Inc., as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2012, and have issued our report thereon dated September 6, 2012. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit, we considered Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing our audit procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over financial reporting.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and would not necessarily identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether Metro Community Development, Inc.'s financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

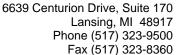
We noted certain other matters that we reported to those charged with governance in a separate letter dated September 6, 2012.

Independent Auditors' Report on Compliance With Requirements That Could Have a Direct and Material Effect on Each Major program and Internal Control Over Compliance in Accordance with OMB Circular A-133

To the Board of Directors of Metro Community Development, Inc. Flint, Michigan

Compliance

We have audited Metro Community Development, Inc.'s compliance with the types of compliance requirements described in the OMB Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement that could have a direct and material effect on each of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2012. Metro Community Development, Inc.'s major federal programs are identified in the summary of auditor's results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. Compliance with the requirements of laws, regulations, contracts and grants applicable to each of its major federal programs is the responsibility of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on Metro Community Development, Inc.'s compliance based on our audit.

We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and OMB Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations. Those standards and OMB Circular A-133 require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about Metro Community Development Inc.'s compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion. Our audit does not provide a legal determination of Metro Community Development Inc.'s compliance with those requirements.

In our opinion, Metro Community Development, Inc. complied, in all material respects, with the compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal program for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2012. However, the results of our auditing procedures disclosed an instance of noncompliance with those requirements, which is required to be reported in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 and which is described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as item 2012-1.

Internal Control over Compliance

Management of Metro Community Development, Inc. is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with requirements of laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to federal programs. In planning and performing our audit, we considered Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over compliance with the requirements that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program to determine the auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on compliance and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of Metro Community Development, Inc.'s internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. A material weakness in internal control over compliance; such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and correct, on a timely basis. Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies, or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above. However, we identified a deficiency in internal control over compliance that we consider to be a significant deficiency as described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as item 2012-1. A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance

Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards

We have audited the financial statements of Metro Community Development, Inc. as of and for the year ended June 30, 2012, and have issued our report thereon dated September 6, 2012, which contained an unqualified opinion on those financial statements. Our audit was performed for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations,* and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

Metro Community Development, Inc.'s response to the finding identified in our audit is described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs. We did not audit Metro Community Development, Inc.'s response and, accordingly, we express no opinion on it.

CURRENT YEAR

2012-1 Minimize Time Elapsing for Transfer of Federal Funds

Program Name: Supportive Housing Program, CFDA 14.235

Finding Type: Noncompliance and significant deficiency

Criteria: Federal guidance states that recipients of federal funds must minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of federal funds to the entity and disbursement. Metro Community Development, Inc's policy is to disburse these funds within three days of drawing the funds from the federal government.

Statement of Condition: Metro Community Development, Inc, is a pass through entity for funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the Supportive Housing Program (SHP). During our testing, we noted two draws for which Metro Community Development, Inc., did not disburse all funds it drew down from HUD to the subrecipients within three days of the receiving the funds from HUD.

Effect of the Condition: Noncompliance with federal guidelines and Metro Community Development, Inc's internal policy.

Cause of Condition: Metro Community Development, Inc, runs checks twice a month. A drawdown of federal funds was made during the interim period when a check run was not scheduled to occur. Therefore, funds were not disbursed to subrecipients within three days of the drawdown.

Recommendation: We recommend that Metro time all drawdowns to occur just before a check run, or increase the frequency of check runs to subrecipients of federal funds.

Agency Corrective Action Plan: We have established a process to ensure that all drawdowns of federal funds are done at the time checks to subrecipients are run, to ensure timely pass through of all federal funds. Prior to initiating a check run, the Office Administrator will ensure that federal funds drawndown are completed and will verify that the check is released within 3 days of the receipt of funds.
