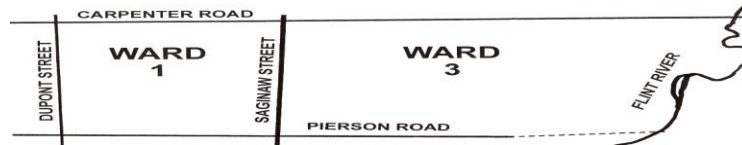


Building Neighborhood Capacity Program (BNCP) Flint BNCP Advisory Council

Role

Scope of Responsibilities

- Actively participate in CSSP technical assistance and training to begin building the capacities required for developing and implementing the revitalization plan;
 - Identify values and principles (what we hold dear)
 - Develop vision (picture of the future with identified desired results)
 - Collect and analyze data (what is the “story behind the data”) for learning and accountability
 - Identify and develop additional technical assistance needed to strengthen existing capacities (knowledge, skills, relationships, interactions and organizational resources) or develop new capacities;
- Collaborate with national consultant on a formative assessment
- Assist in the outreach and communication with neighborhood residents to engage in a results-oriented planning process;
- Identify, strengthen existing partnerships; and
- Create strategic and accountable partnerships (local, state and national) that engage multiple sectors and share accountability for results;
- Address policy and regulatory issues that create barriers to the revitalization goals;
- Assist in the development communication strategies to build public and political will; and
- Make a three year commitment to work with Metro Community Development, the Cross-sector Partnership, and the Anchor Neighborhood Partners to sustain the growth, strengthening of capacities and efforts to improve neighborhood-level results.

Value-driven Approach **We jointly value and agree that:**

- The capacities built, along with the commitment and action of the parties, will lead to better results for residents, families, children and the neighborhoods in which they live.
- Residents will have access to actionable information, the opportunity for input and decision making, and be among the leaders of the BNCP;
- Data must be collected, analyzed and used for learning, decision making and accountability;
- Capacities that are built into the neighborhood will strengthen the social and economic fabric and provide a platform for a new way of doing business;
- All parties have equal authority and accountability for building capacity and pursuing results for all residents and the neighborhood ; and
- The Cross-sector Partnership, Metro Community Development and Anchor Neighborhood Partner stakeholders commit to sustaining the growth and strengthening of capacities and efforts to improve neighborhood-level results after the BNCP is completed.
